Responsible Gaming Strategy

The SIGA Responsible Gaming Strategy has two main goals:

- 1. To provide casino entertainment in a socially responsible manner**
- 2. To provide resources so that patrons can develop and practice responsible gambling behavior.**



The GameSense material provides four key responsible gambling messages to patrons:

Entertainment: SIGA casinos are a place for fun and entertainment

Randomness: Casino games are designed to be random and unpredictable

House Advantage: the house has the advantage in all games.

Safety: SIGA is concerned about your safety while you are a guest at our casinos.

We want patrons to have easy access to the material and to know the following information:

How Gambling Works:

Knowing the rules and how to play the game. Understanding the games are made to be unpredictable and the house has an advantage.

Awareness of Risks:

Understanding gambling involves taking a risk.

Responsible Gambling Tips:

Knowing how to keep gambling safe and fun. For example, setting limits on time and money spent or cashing out when you are ahead.

Problem Gambling Resources:

Knowing where and how to find help if gambling is becoming a concern.
